

If you can e-mail, upload files, and use a genealogy software program, then you have enough knowledge and experience to create and maintain a One-Name Study web site.


The hardest part is deciding what method you are going to use!

Introduction: Evaluation

■ Technical Skills:

- +++ Challenging, large learning curve may need additional support
- ++ Fairly easy, up and running within an hour
- + If you can create e-mails you can do this

■ Maintenance Effort (For each update)

- +++ Allow more than one hour
- ++ Less than one hour
- None, or very little

■ Maintenance Cost*

- +++ Monthly outgoings of over £3 less than £5
- ++ Monthly outgoings of over £1 less than £3
- + Free

Advantages

Disadvantages

* Maintenance Costs does not include the family history program



Why Publish to the Web?

Advantages

- Virtual presence
 - 1980 2001: 20 contacts by letter, or Family History Meetings
 - 2001 2006: 150+ contacts due to website & search engines
- Shares your research with others & encouragement to others to share with you

Disadvantages

- Increase efforts maintaining the data, and the increase in data received
- Possible increased costs (for some methods)







Creating the Narratives Web Pages: Second Site

- Automatically transforms your genealogy data into web pages quickly and easily without knowing any HTML.
- All the files are generated and pages compiled with all the hyperlinks to individual narratives, graphics, charts, lists, indexes.
- The files are included in one folder.
- This folder is uploaded to your website, or to a CD/DVD for distribution
- You can create as many subsets of your data as you like.










Step 3 of 6: Identify your TMG Database



File Preferences - GEDCOM Sharing continued

GEDCOM Sharing:

GEDCOM sharing allows users to download small fragments of submitted GEDCOM files on a controlled basis. You can decide whether you'd like to share your files like this or not. At no time will this feature allow a user to download your whole GEDCOM file. This feature also respects any privacy settings you placed on your file (including your preferences on whether to show notes and/or sources on your file).

Here are the benefits to sharing small portions of your GEDCOM:

- · You contribute to the global genealogy community by sharing your work.
- Without this feature enabled, users are forced to re-type any data that you have published to GenCircles. By enabling this feature, you save other genealogists the time-consuming task of re-typing.
- You will get cited as the source for the data, so you will get full credit for your work. When users have to re-type data, they don't
 always give you a source record.

GenCircles is all about sharing! By choosing to share, you are doing a great service to your fellow genealogists.

- Multiple Ancestors This level of sharing is the most beneficial to other genealogists. It allows others to extract an individual, their immediate family, and several generations of ancestors. # of Ancestor Generations to Allow 7 ▼
- Immediate Family This option allows a researcher to extract the main individual, plus his immediate family (spouses, parents, & children).
- Only single individuals can be extracted from your GEDCOM. This limits other genealogists in that they cannot extract any family information.

To keep everyone current on your genealogy, its beneficial to re-upload your genealogy file every once in a while. This process is seamless and will preserve all information, while making the necessary updates. You have chosen to update the URIDGE-EURIDGE One Name Study file with an updated GEDCOM file. To begin this process, click Browse next to the button below. Then you will select the file that you are sending as an update.

ALERT: After you update your file, it's put in the queue for processing. If you keep updating your file before this processing finishes, you will NOT get your file processed faster. This will move your file further and further back in the gueue and make processing TAKE LONGER! Make sure you select the correct file!! The original filename for your file was GENCIRCLES.GED. 





PHP Websites: Technical View

- PHP stands for PHP: Hypertext Preprocessor.
- PHP is an HTML-embedded scripting language. Much of its syntax is borrowed from C, Java and Perl with a couple of unique PHP-specific features thrown in. The goal of the language is to allow web developers to write dynamically generated pages quickly.
- It normally requires the following to be present on your web site:
 - 1. PHP (a scripting language, 4.0 or higher preferred)
 - 2. MySQL (a database, 4.0.1 or higher preferred, but will also work on earlier versions back to 3.23.0)
 - 3. You may also need an FTP program



PHP Websites: What Does That Mean to a Family Historian?


- It is a powerful way to manage and display your genealogy data on the internet, all without generating a single page of HTML. Instead, your information is stored in MySQL database tables and dynamically displayed in attractive fashion with PHP.
- It stores your data on your server instead of on your own hard drive.
 Alternatively, you can create a GEDCOM, and upload it from your website
- You can make it private so that only you can see the data. Or you can give access to a few other family members, or everyone. You can also allow other people to add information.
- It is installed on a web server (that has a MySQL database)








Step 1 of 3 continued: Confirmation of GEDCOM Upload




Step 2 of 3: Access and Privacy Settings



Step 2 of 3 continued: Edit GEDCOM Privacy Settings




Step 3 of 3: Configuration of Main Page



Close Relatives View




Pedigree Tree View


