Why Publish to the Web?

Advantages

- **Virtual presence**
 - **1980 – 2001: 20 contacts by letter, or Family History Meetings**
 - **2001 – 2006: 150+ contacts due to website & search engines**
- **Shares your research with others & encouragement to others to share with you**

Disadvantages

- **Increase efforts – maintaining the data, and the increase in data received**
- **Possible increased costs (for some methods)**





Reginald Charles EURIDGE was born on 7 September 1921 in [45 Henry Street, Burton upon Trent, Staffordshire](#).^{6,3,4} Reginald was also known as Red EURIDGE.¹ He was the son of [William Harry EURIDGE](#) and [Emily Ann HARPER](#).^{3,4,5} Reginald finished his education in 1936 at [Broadway Central School, Burton upon Trent, Staffordshire](#).⁷ He left school and joined the Royal Marines. 



- **PHP stands for *PHP: Hypertext Preprocessor*.**
- **PHP is an HTML-embedded scripting language. Much of its syntax is borrowed from C, Java and Perl with a couple of unique PHP-specific features thrown in. The goal of the language is to allow web developers to write dynamically generated pages quickly.**
- **It normally requires the following to be present on your web site:**
 - 1. PHP (a scripting language, 4.0 or higher preferred)**
 - 2. MySQL (a database, 4.0.1 or higher preferred, but will also work on earlier versions back to 3.23.0)**
 - 3. You may also need an FTP program**






