Whepstead



Whepstead is in Suffolk, five miles south of Bury St. Edmunds, approximately 80 miles north-east of London. There are plenty of hotels, or bed and breakfasts in this area. For more information on accommodation contact the Bury St. Edmunds tourist office.

Pask Surname & Variants

The surname Pask is derived from a word used for Easter, and is from the Hebrew pesakh 'a passing over', and refers to a person born at Easter. The Pasque flower blooms at Easter time.

The name PASK and its variants PAARSK, PARSK, PASCH, PASCK, PASGC, PASGE, PASK-HUGHES, PASK-SMITH, PASK-WHITE, PASKE, PASKE-JONES, PASKS, PASKUE, and PASQUE originate from four main areas in the UK - Lincolnshire, Suffolk, Monmouthshire, and Essex.

Today, their descendants can be located throughout the UK and the world. We are in contact with over 150 families and researchers worldwide.
