and I do hereby make ordain constitute and appoint the

aforesaid Ellen paskie my wife sole executrix of this my last Will and testament In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this fourteenth day of April in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and forty six Geo. Paskie signed sealed published and declared by the said George Paskie to be his last Will and testament in the presence of us who have hereunder set our names in his presence as witnesses thereto Jas. Bailey John Glascock Thomas Glascock Junr.

I Elizabeth Pell of Surrey Saint Edmunds in the County of Suffolk Spinster being of sound and disposing mind and memory do make and declare this my last Will and testament in manner and form following that is to say first I commend my soul into the hands of Almighty God and my body I commit to the earth to be decently buried by my Executor herein after named and as to my temporal Estate I give and bequeath the same in manner following

Imprimis I give to the poor of the parish where I am buried five pounds I also give devise and bequeath unto my sister Mary Goodrich wife of Robert Goodrich of Saint Edmunds Surrey aforesaid Gentleman all my messuages land tenements and hereditaments whatsoever situate lying and being in Bretenem Thorpe and Great Waldingfield in the said County of Suffolk for and during the term of her natural life without impeachment or waif and from and after her death I give the said messuages land tenements and hereditaments of Bretenem Thorpe and Great Waldingfield aforesaid to Pell Ssigham my nephew and his heirs for ever I also give the use of one moiety or half part of my plate to my sister Mary Goodrich for and during her natural life and from and after her death to Pell Ssigham my nephew I also give the moiety or half of my household lining to my sister Mary Goodrich as also one moiety or half part of my rings and also one hundred pound and twenty pound for mourning I also give to Robert Goodrich my brother in law twenty pounds for mourning I give to Elizabeth Farrow my servant maid the sum of fifty pounds as also all my wearing apparel except such of the best of them as my sister Mary Goodrich shall like to have all the rest of my real and personal Estate whatsoever and wheresoever not already disposed off I give devise and bequeath unto Pell Ssigham my nephew and his heirs for ever he paying my just debts
